Some Class I and II Rapids, and occasional Class III, and many channel splits will be encountered, but overall the course is relatively easy. Course will be patrolled.

Registration fee includes camping fees, firewood, and entertainment each day. Most Voyageurs Rendezvous 2017 events are open at no charge, excepting the Civic Reception and Banquet and Voyageurs Ball. 1965, 1966, 1967 and 1970 Centennial Voyageurs - Honourary Guests - Complimentary Banquet and Voyageurs Ball Tickets.
