Entry Fee: \$200 per team, includes Canada 150 Medallions, Reception, Banquet, Voyageurs Ball

Rules and Regulations:

Contest open to paddlers 18 years, June 24, 2017, or a paddler may be 14 years, June 24, 2017, if accompanied by a paddling parent.

All paddlers must sign waivers prior to start time.

Mandatory Equipment (Canoes as below):

- 1. Canoes 15', 16', 17' in Men's, Ladies', and Mixed Classes, subject to entry numbers Canoes 18', 18'6", 19' in Men's, Ladies' and Mixed Classes, subject to entry numbers
- 2. Single shaft paddles (one spare paddle).
- 3. Each paddler must wear a PFD.
- 4. Each canoe must have 75 ft. of 3/8 poly recovery line in throw bag or wrapped tightly on a life preserver, attached to stern, stored in stern.
- 5. Safety pack fastened in canoe. Pack to hold: 2 rain jackets, 2 dry t-shirts, 12 power /candy bars, one roll duct tape.
- * Spray covers optional, but recommended
- * Drinking tube fluid containers optional
